'SAFETY-ON-THE-JOB' Poster Contest

Celebrating North American Occupational Safety and Health (NAOSH) Week

May 6-12, 2012

Please ensure to read and follow all the rules carefully so that all poster designs will be eligible. The posters that best illustrate job safety will be selected as winners. Before the children begin drawing, we urge you to talk to them about your job and workplace safety. Provide examples of everyday health and safety risks, hazard and workplace situation you face in your job.

Entry is open to City of Ottawa employees' children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews between the ages of 5 and 14. Age categories for judging are:

- ➤ ages 5-7;
- > ages 8-11; and
- > ages 12-14

The poster design must relate to the theme 'Safety-on-the-Job' and should illustrate an example of safety at work. As you know, the description of the workplace is wide-ranging - it can be at an office, in a garage, on the road, at home, construction sites, parks, pools, schools, etc. Encourage your children to be creative!

- 1. The finished poster must be no larger than 11" x 14". Only crayons, markers, color pencils or paints can be used.
- 2. Only one entry per child will be allowed. Employees are limited to verbal assistance only. All drawings must be an individual effort and be free-hand originals. No traced pictures please.
- 3. Employees from the Occupational Health and Safety Branch are not eligible to enter the contest.
- 4. Each poster must have the entry form attached to the back of the poster to be eligible.

- 5. Criteria for judging are determined by the creativity and how well the poster expresses the contest theme 'Safety-on-the-Job.' Winning posters will be announced at the end of NAOSH week. A panel of independent judges will choose the winners.
